Subject:-Grant of conditional permission to Gopabandhu Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya, V.I.P. Road, Puri-2, Puri, Odisha-752002 (Inst. ID-AYU0206) with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats (19 seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses namely (I) Kayachikitsa- 07 seats (08 seats including EWS), (II) Shalya Tantra - 03 seats (04 seats including EWS), (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga- 01 seats (02 seats including EWS), (iv) Kaumarbhritya- Bala Roga- 02 seats (without EWS) (v) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana- 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) for the academic session 2022-23 under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under in respect of appeal dated 04.11.2022-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

- 1. This is with reference to your first appeal filed by the Commissioner-cum-Secretary to Government of Odisha vide ref No. HFW-AYUR-AYURM-0093-2022 25006/H dated 04.11.2022 to the commission in respect of denial of permission issued to Kaviraj Anantha Tripathy Sharma Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, AT/PO- Ankushpur, VIA-Kukudakhandi, Berhampur-Ganjam, Odisha-761100 (Inst. ID- AYU0209), Gopabandhu Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya, V.I.P. Road, Purl-2, Purl, Odisha-752002 (Inst. ID-AYU0206), Government Ayurved college Bolangir, AT Tulsi Nagar, Bolangir-767001 Orissa (Inst. ID- AYU0210) for conducting UG and PG courses as the case may be due to not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for poat-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder due to non availability of teaching, non-teaching staff, hospital staff and other shortcoming as mentioned in denial orders dated 21.10.2022, 18.10.2022 & 15.11.2022 respectively
- 2. Thereafter the said appeal was placed before the Chairman, NCISM and Chairman NCISM constituted a Hearing Committee to provide an opportunity of hearing to the college. Accordingly, the letter was sent to The Commissioner-cum-Secretary to Government of Odisha vide Commission's letter Ref. No. NCISM/Comm./Appeal/(2022-23) dated 14.11.2022 to appear before the designated hearing committee as constituted by the Chairman, NCISM on 21.11.2022 in respect of appeal filed under section 10(1)(g) and section 24(3) of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020 and to produce all relevant valid documents/records/ proof to substantiate the claims and make written submission and submit an authenticated copy of evidence/verifications to commission with shortcoming wise clarifications mentioned in the denial orders dated 21.10.2022 passed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM. The proceedings of appeal were held virtually on 21.11.2022 at 4.00 PM and on behalf of Government of Odisha, Smt. Shalini Pandit, Commissioner-cum-Secretary to Government, Health & Family welfare Department, Government of Odisha attended the hearing.
- The hearing committee sought clarification from the representatives of Government of Odisha regarding shortcomings mentioned in the denial order dated 18.10.2022 passed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM, which is as under:-

- (i) Availability of Total Teaching Faculty after considering the submissions the college is 88% which is not fulfilling the minimum criteria of 90%, as required in Schedule V of MSR 2016.
- (ii) Availability of Non-Teaching Staff is 35.40 % which is not fulfilling the minimum criteria of 80%, as required in Schedule VI of MSR 2016.
- (iii) Availability of Hospital Staff is 53% which is not fulfilling the minimum criteria of 80%, as required in Schedule IV of MSR 2016.
- (iv) Computerisedcentral registration system is not available as required in Regulation 3(1) of MSR 2016.
- (v) Non availability of General and essential equipments/instruments as required in schedule VII of MSR 2016.
- (vi) CentralResearch Laboratory is not available as required in Regulation 7(3) of PG Regulation 2016.
- (VII) USG facility is not available

That in order to overcome the deficiencies and shortcomings as observed in Govt. Ayurvedic Colleges of the State, the Govt. of Odisha have taken many active steps in respect of teaching faculties (both lower & higher), non-teaching staff, hospital staff, general and essential equipment/instruments etc. and steps are also being taken to comply the deficiencies as per NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations made thereunder, and on the basis of relaxation policy issued by the NCISM at the earliest.

With this assurance/undertaking, it is requested that in the interest of the academic benefit of meritorious students desirous to pursue U.G. (BAMS) and P.G. (MD/MS) courses in the state, kindly reconsider the denial permission for admission in U.G. (BAMS) and P.G. (M.D./M.S.) courses in the aforesald Govt. Ayurvedic colleges in the academic year 2022-23.

It is, therefore, requested that the aforementioned Govt. Ayurvedic Colleges may kindly be granted conditional permission for admission in UG and PG courses in the academic year 2022-23.

So, irrespective of that orders, we send affidavit of all three Govt. Ayurveda Colleges and please consider all the three colleges.

And with respect to this, committee agreed to consider another college also as per affidavit submitted by Govt. of Odisha vide ref no. R 280521 dated 22.11.2022 along with the submission.

- 4. The submission made by the Govt. of Odisha was placed before the designated hearing committee and hearing committee sought clarification regarding the shortcomings mentioned in the denial orders dated 18.10.2022 and also asked for the compliance of Shortcomings and asked the representatives to submit the affidavit regarding their assurance in respect of fulfillment of all requisite as mentioned in the denial order.
- In response of the same, the Commissioner-cum-Secretary to Government, Health & Family welfare Department, Government of Odisha has submitted affidavit no. 280521 vide ref. no HFW-AYUR-AYURM-0096-2022-26506/H dated 22.11.2022 with the affirmation that all the shortcomings will be fulfilled within 31st Dec. 2022.
- 6. Hence, in view of an affidavit no. 280521 vide ref. no HFW-AYUR-AYURM-0096-2022-26506/H dated 22.11.2022 submitted by the Commissioner-cum-Secretary to Government, Health & Family welfare Department, Government of Odisha, the Chairman, NCISM directed the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian conditional permission to Gopabandhu Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya, V.I.P. Road, Puri-2, Puri, Odisha-752002 (Inst. EWS) in 05 PG courses namely (I) Kayachikitsa-07 seats (08 seats including EWS), (ii) Shalya Tantra 03 Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga-02 seats (without EWS) (v) Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kaipana-02 seats (03 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23.

Therefore, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to issue conditional permission to Gopabandhu Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya, V.I.P. Road, Puri-2, Puri, Odisha-52002 (Inst. 1D-AYU0206) for 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats (19 seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 07 seats (08 seats including EWS), (ii) Shalya Tantra - 03 seats (04 seats including EWS), (iii) Prasuti & Stri Roga- 01 seats (02 seats including EWS), (iv) Kaumarbhritya- Bala Roga- 02 seats (without EWS) (v) Rasa Shastra & Bhalshajya Kalpana- 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) on the basis of the affidavit no. 280521 vide ref. no HFW-AYUR-AYURM-0096-2022-26506/H dated 22.11.2022 submitted by the Commissioner-cum-Secretary to Government , Health & Family welfare Department, Government of Odisha, subject to following condition:-

- (i) It is further informed that minimum 15% of Undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) and 15 seats (19 seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2022-23 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college falls to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations there under.
- Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2022 and send a compliance report to get permission for the session 2023-24:
 - all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;

all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);

iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto,

- 11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2023-24.
- 12. Please acknowledge the receipt of this letter.
