**Subject:- Grant of conditional permission to Gopabandhu Ayurveda Mahavidhyalaya, VIP Raod, Puri- 752002, Orissa (AYU0206) with 51 seats (64 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats (19 seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 07 seats (08 seats including EWS) (ii) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga- 02 seats (without EWS) (iii) Ras Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana- 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 01 seat (02 seats including EWS) (v) Shalya Tantra-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24-regarding.**

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

1. It is pertinent to mention here that conditional permission to take admission with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats (19 seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 07 seats (08 seats including EWS) (ii) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga- 02 seats (without EWS) (iii) Ras Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana- 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 01 seat (02 seats including EWS) (v) Shalya Tantra-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) **for the A.Y 2022-23 was issued to you on the basis of affidavit no. 280521 vide reference no. HFW-AYUR-AYURM-0096-2022-26506/H dated 22.11.2022 submitted by the Commissioner-Cum-Secretary to Govt., Health and Family Welfare Department, Govt. of Odisha at the time of first appeal filed by you to the Commission, NCISM for issuance of conditional permission for the academic year 2022-2023.**
2. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Gopabandhu Ayurveda Mahavidhyalaya, VIP Raod, Puri- 752002, Orissa (AYU0206)** inspection of your College was conducted **on 11.05.2023 & 12.05.2023 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional Permission with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats (19 seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 07 seats (08 seats including EWS) (ii) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga- 02 seats (without EWS) (iii) Ras Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana- 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 01 seat (02 seats including EWS) (v) Shalya Tantra-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.**
3. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. On examining the case in light of above notified and approved criteria and on perusal of the visitation report, it was observed that the college was not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria due to following shortcomings: -

**1. College website:-**

- a) Information uploaded on college website is not available.

- a) Quality testing laboratory not available.

8 **Observation by the visitors: -**

- No neonatal room, scrub room and recovery room found.
- No Shalakyia OT theatre.
- X-Ray machine is not in working condition, no radiologist chamber, radiologist, X-Ray chamber, dark room film drying room and USG.
- No green house and demonstration room available in herbal garden.
- No diet register was available.

- In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **42<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **07.06.2023**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no.** dated **16.06.2023** to appear on **20.06.2023** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to your college with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats (19 seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 07 seats (08 seats including EWS) (ii) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga- 02 seats (without EWS) (iii) Ras Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana- 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 01 seat (02 seats including EWS) (v) Shalya Tantra-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2023-24.**
- The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide 2019/GAM dated 19.06.2023** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Sudarshan Behra Principal** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **20.06.2023** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. **3.c)1.Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana:-** Prof. (Dr.) Rajib Kishore Jena having teacher code AYRB00824 has been promoted to the post of Professor vide order no. 16531/H, dt.27.07.2022(Annexure -8) adjoined in the post on 28.07.2022 (Annexure - 9). Due to non updation of personal profile of Prof. Jena, he could not be enrolled in the Part-1 visitation proforma 2023 as Professor in the Dept. of Rasashastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana.

Moreover Dr. Rajib Kishore Jena has joined more than 10years of Teaching Experience for which Dr. Jena is eligible for the post of Professor as per NCISM, MSE-2022 Teaching Experience enclosed. Hence Dr. Jena may be considered as Professor.

**3.c)2.Prasuti & Stri Roga:-** The OPSC, Odisha, Cuttack has advertised for recruitment for the post of Lecturer in the Dept. of Prasuti Tantra and the sanctioned post of Lecturer (LF) in the Dept. of P.T.S.R will be filled up very soon.

**3.c)1. Rasa Shastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana:-** Principal submitted that Dr. Rajib Kishore Jena has been promoted to the post of Professor. Promotion order submitted and verified.

Committee verified OTMS and observed that Dr. Rajib Kishore is not eligible for promotion as he does not have experience of 10 years. Principal showed a document wherein the experience of Dr. Rajib Kishore is shown for more than 10 years.

Committee observed that the experience of the faculty must be updated on OTMS and to be verified.

**7.e).1.** Due to shifting duty in the Hospital, maternity leave and casual leave, some hospital staff were absent on the day of visitation. Some hospital staffs are engaged on out-sourced basis and performing their duties w.e.f. 31.12.2022. They were not provided with Identity Card on the day of Visitation. However now they have been provided with Identity Cards. The AMOs deployed to the Hospital are getting their salary from their place of posting by the concerned DDOs. The Hospital Staff i.e. Lab. Technician, Lab. Assistant, Ward Boy, Dresser, OT attendant, Staff Nurse, Pharmacist, Radiographer, etc. are being engaged by Out- Sourcing Agencies. Their Monthly remuneration is being paid to the man power providing agency. Hence they are not enrolled in the acquaintance register.

(i) Matron- Matron is a promotional post which Microbiologist, will be filled up through DPC from among the Staff.

(ii) Staff - Nurse: As per MSR, 17 nos of Staff Biochemist, nurse i.e. 15 nos for 150 bedded Hospital, 1 for OT Pharmacologist and 1 for Panchakarma are required. 04 nos of regular staff nurses and 16 mos. of staff nurses have been engaged on out sourced basis are working in the hospital. (iii) Ward Boy - 08 nos. of ward boy/AYA are required for 150 bedded hospital i.e. 1 for each 20 beds as per MSR. 08 nos of Ward boy/Aya are working in the hospital which were enrolled in the part I visitation proforma in Hospital Staff Details.

(iv) Dresser - An out sider Sri. Swadhin Sangram Padhi has been engaged as Dresser on Out sourced basis which was enrolled in the part-1 Visitation Proforma. Hence there is no deficiency of Dresser.

(v) Laboratory Technician- The post of Laboratory Technician will be filled up by out sourced basis.

(vi) Micro-Biologist - Steps are being taken for filling up of the post of Micro-Biologist.

(vii) Panchakarma Assistant - Prasant Kumar Das, Jyotiranjan Sahoo and Lalit Mohan Rout are engaged on out sourced basis as Panchakarma Assistant and were enrolled in the part-1 Visitation Proforma. Hence there is no deficiency of Panchakarma Assistant.

(viii), Blo-Chemist - Steps are being taken for filling up of the post of Bio-Chemist.

(ix) Pharmacologist - Steps are being taken for filling up of the post of Pharmacologist.

The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", "The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, **and once**



again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 44<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 23.06.2023.

7. WHEREAS, in view of the shortcoming and deficiencies mentioned in above paras, and as per the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and it is found that the college is not fulfilling the **basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 60 seats (75 Including EWS) in UG ( BAMS) Course & 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) in the department of Rasa Shastra under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020. However, Board decided to issue conditional permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2023-24.**

***"For deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5 % of total intake capacity."***

Accordingly as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 44<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of MARBISM, college is having only 24 total eligible Teaching faculty excluding excess staff and additional staff for PG course.

There is deficiency of 03 teachers for issuance of conditional permission for academic session 2023-24 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. **Therefore, in accordance of Reduction policy 2023-2024, for deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5% of total intake capacity.** Therefore, after applying the seat Reduction Policy college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **conditional permission with 51 seats (64 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)]** in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.

***"In case of non availability of Professor in the Post graduate department or specialty permission shall be granted as per the teacher student ratio by reducing the intake strength in the concerned department"***.

As per sub regulation 1 of regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016, The teacher-student ratio shall be such that the number of post-graduate teachers to the number of post-graduate students admitted per year is maintained as 1:3 in case of Professor and 1:2 in case of Reader or Associate Professor and as per sub regulation 2 of regulation 16 of (PG Ayurveda Education) Regulation 2016 The teacher student ratio shall be 1:1 in case of Lecturer or Assistant Professor having minimum of five years teaching experience

As, college is having 04 eligible teaching faculty in the department of Ras Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana (02 Associate Professor and 02 Lecturer) and as per the available faculty, college is fulfilling the teacher : student ratio as per the submitted seats in Part-1 and eligible for issuance of permission with 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) in the department of Ras Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana.

Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2023-24 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **conditional permission with 51 seats (64 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)]** in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats (19 seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 07 seats (08 seats including EWS) (ii) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga- 02 seats (without EWS) (iii) Ras Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana- 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 01 seat (02 seats including EWS) (v) Shalya Tantra-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2023-24.

8. Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, **Conditional Permission is granted to Gopabandhu Ayurveda Mahavidhyalaya, VIP Raod, Puri- 752002, Orissa (AYU0206) with 51 seats (64 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)]** in UG (BAMS) course and 15 seats (19 seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses in the subject namely (i) Kayachikitsa- 07 seats (08 seats including EWS) (ii) Kaumarbhritya-Bala Roga- 02 seats (without EWS) (iii) Ras Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana- 02 seats (03 seats including EWS) (iv) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 01 seat (02 seats including EWS) (v) Shalya Tantra-03 seats (04 seats including EWS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations there under for the academic session 2023-24.

- (i) It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 51 seats (64 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)]** and **15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 15 seats (19 seats including EWS) in 05 PG courses** seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
10. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2024-25:**
- All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016
  - All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
  - all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
